Report on 2021



Pollinator Habitat Creation & Enhancement

At Concordia in 2021, we hosted two pollinator planting activities at our organic garden on campus. The first took place in June, where we invited the campus and larger Moorhead community to our campus organic garden to help plant one side of our garden with native plant plugs. The second pollinator event took place in October, when we hosted an “Autumn Garden Party” at our campus garden. We walked volunteers through sowing native pollinator seeds on the remaining three sides of our garden.

Education & Outreach

In 2021, Moorhead saw increased activity surrounding pollinators. A few native pollinator plantings took place in the community throughout the summer. One planting was established by members of the Moorhead Community Resilience Task Force, which Concordia is a part of, and another was established at the Moorhead Public Works facility by staff from the City of Moorhead. Additionally, one of our pollinator passionate community members led a “Pollinator Power Walk”, which involved leading a tour for interested community members of a few pollinator plantings in one area of Moorhead. This event had a great turnout, and we are hoping to continue it in the future. Lastly, members from the Moorhead Community Resilience Task Force and the City of Moorhead applied for a grant to fund several large-scale pollinator plantings, totaling about 15 acres, across the city in 2022.
